Dear Reader,

The role of a school extends beyond academic excellence; it is to motivate and empower students to become lifelong learners, critical thinkers, and productive members of an ever-changing global society. St. Joseph's School provides a blend of scholastic and co-scholastic activities that help shape every individual into a self-reliant and independent citizen. I am reminded of the words of Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam, an alumnus of a Jesuit College. While addressing engineering students, he posed the question, "What is knowledge?" He defined knowledge as the **sum of creativity, righteousness, and courage.**

First, we must strive to be creative in our endeavours. Our school endeavours to unveil the innate potentials of students through various activities and programs. Second, Dr. Kalam explained righteousness as having beauty in character, which brings harmony to the home, order to the nation, and ultimately peace to the world. The starting point of peace begins in the heart. With this principle in mind, St. Joseph's consistently focuses on character formation, creating individuals who are 'persons for others.' I always tell my students that it's better to be unique than the best, because being the best makes you number one, but being unique makes you the only one. I would like to conclude with a story that illustrates the necessity of seizing opportunities and enduring hardships to achieve success.

Once, an artist—a sculptor—was searching for a stone to create a deity for a temple. Suddenly, he spotted the perfect stone. As he approached, the stone implored, "Please don't make me into an idol." The artist reassured, "Your life will change; people will revere you once you become an idol." The stone protested, "I can't endure the chiselling." Regretfully, the artist moved on. Later, he found another stone, which he skilfully transformed into a revered idol.

The idol was placed within the temple, where people came to offer flowers and prayers. Eventually, a stone was needed to break coconuts as offerings. The very stone that had refused the artist's chisel was chosen. It was now just a stone in front of the temple, bearing the blows meant to crack open coconuts—an ignoble fate it had chosen for itself.

STUDENTS VISIT TO INSTITUTE OF WOOD SCIENCE & TECHNOLOGY

An educational visit to the Institute of Wood Science and Technology was organized for Class 11 and 12 biology students on 21st August,2023. The target of the visit was to provide students with practical insights into Wood processing, Timber technology, Tissue culture, Molecular Biology and its applications. The visit aimed to enhance their understanding of wood as a renewable resource and its importance in various industries. The Institute of Wood Science and Technology is located in Bengaluru a place dedicated to research and education in the field of wood science. It serves as a hub for students, researchers, and professionals interested in understanding the properties, processing, and applications of wood.

The visit began with a comprehensive tour of the tissue culture laboratory, molecular biology, pathology laboratory and the museum. Students were introduced to the various equipment used for tissue culture, wood testing, including moisture content analysis, density measurements, and strength testing. They were able to witness and gain first-hand information on the intricate processes involved in wood research. A discussion on the sustainable aspects of wood was held, emphasizing its renewability and low carbon footprint compared to other construction materials. Students were encouraged to consider the environmental implications of their future career choices.

Various wood applications were showcased in a video, ranging from traditional carpentry to advanced uses in construction, furniture manufacturing, and even renewable energy generation. This segment allowed students to appreciate the versatility of wood. The visit concluded with an engaging Q & A session where students had the opportunity to ask questions about wood science, careers in the field, and sustainability practices.

The visit received positive feedback from both students and faculty. Participants expressed an interest in wood science and its potential applications.
